Reflection & Discussion Questions The Power of Words Proverbs 18:21

- 1. According to *The Complete Word Study Dictionary Old Testament,* the word *death* used in Proverbs 18:21, "signifies death occurring to both natural and violent means. Figuratively, the term expresses the idea of ruin and destruction, especially when contrasted with the desirable notions of life, prosperity and happiness."
 - ° Why do you think death is mentioned before life in Proverbs 18:21?
 - ° How can words bring death through *natural* means?
 - How can they bring death through *violent* means?
 - ° Without using names, give examples of how you have seen words bring about death.
- 2. In contrast to death, according to *The Complete Word Study Dictionary Old Testament*, the Hebrew word for *life* means "a living thing."
 - How can words be living things?
 - ° List ways that words can bring life.
 - ° Give examples of how your words to others or their words to you have brought life.
- 3. Several of the proverbs contrast the positive and negative use of the tongue. Fill in the chart below, indicating how words can bring death or life.

Why or why not? If so, what qualities does this person need to have? How does this type of a conversation differ from gossip, slander, or rumors, or does it?
- 10. The tongue is very powerful!! Take some time to sit with the Lord and meditate on the first part of Proverbs 18:21; ask Him to show you how your words are bringing death and how they are bringing life to others.
